North Devon Council protocol on recording/filming at Council meetings

The Council is committed to openness and transparency in its decision-making. Recording is permitted at Council meetings that are open to the public. Members of the public that attend meetings must be aware that these meetings are open to the public and so therefore both individuals and the Council itself have the right to record the meeting. The Council understands that some members of the public attending its meetings may not wish to be-filmed. The Chair of the meeting will make sure any request not to be filmed is respected.

The rules that the Council will apply are:

- 1. The recording must be overt (clearly visible to anyone at the meeting) and must not disrupt proceedings. The Council will put signs up at any meeting where we know recording is taking place.
- 2. The Chair of the meeting has absolute discretion to stop or suspend recording if, in their opinion, continuing to do so would prejudice proceedings at the meeting or if the person recording is in breach of these rules.
- 3. We will ask for recording to stop if the meeting goes into 'part B' where the public is excluded for confidentiality reasons. In such a case, the person recording should leave the room ensuring all recording equipment is switched off.
- 4. Any member of the public has the right not to be filmed. We ensure that agendas for, and signage at, Council meetings make it clear that recording can take place anyone not wishing to be filmed must advise the Chair at the earliest opportunity to allow them to be directed to an area in the room where they will not be caught on camera. Subject to paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, audio recordings shall be permitted at all times during public meetings.
- 5. The recording should not be edited in a way that could lead to misinterpretation or misrepresentation of the proceedings or in a way that ridicules or shows a lack of respect for those in the recording. The Council would expect any recording in breach of these rules to be removed from public view.

The following information came from the Head of Customer Focus and was sent to members of the Strategy and Resources Committee ahead of its meeting on Monday 7 October 2024 in relation to item 9 on the agenda: Household Support Fund 6.

Central Government has announced a new household Support Fund for the period of October 2024 – March 2025. From Devon County Council's allocation of just over £5 million, NDC is to receive £349,975 to award to our residents. This is the 6th fund we have administered since 2021.

We are proposing to administer with a mixture of direct awards applications, as with all our previous schemes.

Along with other districts in Devon, we are looking to direct award to pensionable age households which receive council tax reduction (means tested) but do not receive pension credit (which would entitle them to the winter fuel payment). We can do this in two different ways (a) a set amount to all households or (b) staggered amounts dependent on income.

Options are below:

(a) Award either £100/£150/£175/£200 to all pensionable age households who are on a low income (receiving council tax reduction which is a means tested benefit) but are not currently in receipt of pension credit

Totals for this option 988 Households: £100 = £98,800, £150 = £148,200, £175 = £172,900, £200 = £197,600

(b) Split the pensionable age households who are on a low income (receiving council tax reduction which is a means tested benefit) but are not in receipt of pension credit by income:

Households which are either below the pension credit threshold but not yet applied / had an application approved or are within $\pounds 50$ of the threshold per week

 $532 \times £200 = £106,400$

Households above £50 per week of the threshold = $456 \times £100 = £45,600$ Total for this option: £152,000

This would leave between: £150k - £250k for applications. Based on previous schemes, an allocation for applications of approximately £150k – £200k is most appropriate.
