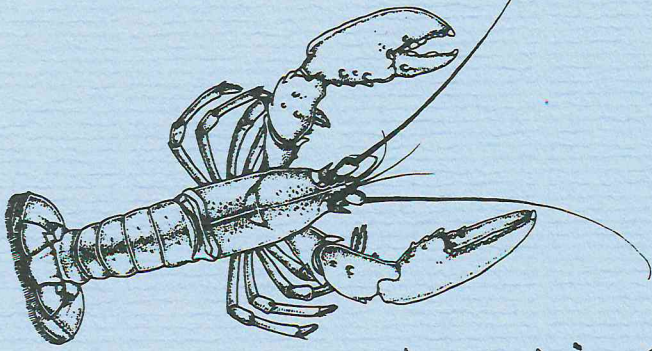


Legendary Lynmouth Lobster

Dear Mrcombe Harbourmaster,

Further to our conversation today I would like to draw your attention to two issues.

1: The need for a long term plan for annual clearance of rocks from beside the low tide landings. Once the strategy is agreed I estimate one day per annum with a tracked 5 ton digger would be adequate.

However three days with digger plus dumper would be required to remedy a few years of neglect and poor management; subject to clear policy of defending from flood rises which scour the beach alongside the landings.

2: In the absence of funds to properly repair the collapsed causeway near the low water (neap tide) level, may I suggest a repair to the causeway capping only; in a few places where the stones are still in place but indanger of breaking out. This would maintain access to the still intact lower landings.

I estimate 5 ready mix lorries, one per day. No re-bar or shuttering would be needed, just man power to drive a dumper and place stones to finish the concrete repairs to the causeway cap.

I would be happy to meet on site at your convenience.
