I am writing to oppose the above application, 1. To enable the supply of alcohol on and off the premises Monday to Sunday from 12.00 hours to 21.30 hours. 2. To enable recorded music on the premises Monday to Sunday from 12.00 hours to 21.30 hours.

- 1. It looks as though it is intended that customers could buy drinks then wander around the village with them. This is completely unacceptable.
- 2.
