To prevent crime and disorder	Selling Alcohol out of site behind shops along side a public footpath with no seating will inevitably lead to crime and disorder.
Public safety	The proposed site is on the edge of the very busy public footpath/lane from the centre of the village to the beach, where cars, vans and trucks are parked. There is a narrow entrance on steep incline with no pavement with poor visibility to and from the main road through the village... Alcohol, music, plus this busy access is a dangerous combination.
To prevent public nuisance	This location is very close to residential properties. The land was granted permission as a car park for local staff and traders. Police and Environmental Health have already been involved due to loud music. The litter, can, bottles and food waste are now a contribution to the derelict and neglected appearance of this area. There is also no provision of WC

To protect children from harm	<p>The busy footpath is at the heart of the village and used by people of all ages... including young families... walking and cycling to the beach.</p> <p>To add alcohol sales from a van enroute not only will be dangerous but will send a negative message and have a detrimental impact and example at the centre of the village.</p> <p>There is enough responsible alcohol sales provision including three Pubs, and four + licenced cafes/restaurants plus off sales from local shops.</p> <p>The location is very close to the children's play park at the back of the car park and the recently refurbished village green. Roaming drinkers are likely to be attracted to these locations with harmful and negative consequences and risks for children.</p>
