1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. This report seeks to allocate S106 public open space funds towards a project in project in Berrynarbor.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1. That Strategy & Resources allocates:
 - 2.1.1. £3,359 to Berrynarbor Parish Council towards the construction of a Boulodromes at The Recreation Field, Pitt Hill, Berrynarbor.
- 2.2. Subject to approval of 2.1.1 above, that Strategy & Resources Committee recommends Council vary the capital programme by £3,359 and that funds be released, subject to a Funding Agreement upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed by the Senior Solicitor, for external projects.

3. REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1. To allocate funds in line with the requirement of S106 agreements.
- 3.2. To protect and enhance public open space, including land.

4. REPORT

4.1. Construction of a Boulodromes at The Recreation Field, Pitt Hill, Berrynarbor – Berrynarbor Parish Council.

A Boulodromes is an area (usually 15x4m) of sand/stone construction where people can play games such as Boules and Petanque. Members of the community in Berrynarbor have created a committee who wish to deliver a facility to play Boules. The committee approached the Parish Council to request the facility is constructed on Parish Council land and has received support from the wider public in the village. The facility will be open-access and available free of charge.

5. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

5.1. Construction of a Boulodromes at The Recreation Field, Pitt Hill, Berrynarbor – Berrynarbor Parish Council.

Financial – The total project cost is £3,359



It is proposed that £3,359 be funded from the S106 capital budget from the following sources:
