1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. This report seeks to allocate S106 public open space funds for the construction of new Play Equipment on Ilfracombe Seafront.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1. That Strategy and Resources Committee allocates £87,023.79 to the Council's budget for the Ilfracombe Seafront Improvement Project for the construction of new Play Equipment on Ilfracombe Seafront.
- 2.2. That the exact location be agreed in consultation with all Ilfracombe Ward Members.
- 2.3. Subject to approval of 2.1 and 2.2 above, that Strategy and Resources Committee recommends Council vary the capital programme by £87,023.79 and that funds be released so that the project can be delivered by the NDC Ilfracombe Seafront Improvement Project Team.
