Topic: Approval and release of S106 Public Open Space Funds - Tarka Leisure Centre, Barnstaple

- 1. INTRODUCTION
 - 1.1. This report seeks to allocate S106 public open space funds to a project at Tarka Leisure Centre, Barnstaple.
- 2. RECOMMENDATIONS
 - 2.1. That Strategy and Resources Committee allocates £65,000 to construct a new cycle and pedestrian path.
 - 2.2. To consider the outcomes of the Equality Impact Assessment as summarised in paragraph 6 of the report.
 - 2.3. Subject to the approval of 2.1 and consideration of 2.2, that Strategy and Resources Committee recommends Council vary the capital programme by £65,000 and the funds be released to deliver the project.

3. REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1. To allocate funds in line with the requirement of the S106 agreement.
- 3.2. To protect and enhance public open space.
- 4. REPORT
 - 4.1. On 3 July 2023, Strategy and Resources Committee agreed to enter into a contract for the delivery of a new long stay car park to allow for the redevelopment of the existing long stay car park.
 - 4.2. The new long stay car park will be located to the west of a footpath owned by North Devon Council, which runs adjacent to Tarka Leisure Centre Artificial Grass Pitch. The new car park will adjoin the existing footpath.
 - 4.3. This report seeks the funding required to add an additional section of path that will link to the rear of Tarka Leisure Centre so that users can easily and safely access the leisure facilities from the new long stay car park. The proposed path is subject to planning approval.
 - 4.4. The proposed footpath will be a 3m wide cycle and pedestrian pathway made of tarmac and incorporating steps and ramp, design attached as appendix 1.
 - 4.5. The Council's Senior Engineer has estimated the cost of the project at £65,000.



5. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

5.1. The total cost of delivering this scheme is estimated to be £65,000. It is proposed that the costs be funded from the following source:
