

- (*) A 'disclosable pecuniary interest' is defined in the Relevant Authorities (Disclosable Pecuniary Interests) Regulations 2012, SI 2012/1464, and includes matters set out in Part A above.

Notes to the form:

1. The monitoring officer of a 'relevant authority' is required to establish and maintain a register of members' interests: Localism Act 2011 s 29(1).

A member or co-opted member must notify the authority's monitoring officer of any disclosable pecuniary interests before the end of 28 days beginning with the day on which the person becomes a member or co-opted member of the authority: Localism Act 2011 s 30(1). If the interest is not in the authority's register, and is not the subject of a pending notification, the member must notify the authority's monitoring officer of the interest before the end of 28 days beginning with the date when the member first becomes aware that he has a disclosable pecuniary interest: Localism Act 2011 s 31(7).

Local authorities' codes of conduct should require that members complete the details of such a register; this may include interests other than disclosable pecuniary interests. For forms of codes of conduct, see Forms 22 [1153]–25 [1178] above. For further details on the local authority ethical framework, see Paragraph 60 [327] above. For the meaning of 'relevant authority' see the Localism Act 2011 s 27(6) (as amended by the Localism Act 2011 ss 36, 237, Sch 25 Pt 5 and the Policing and Crime Act 2017 s 9(3)(c), Sch 2 paras 118, 119).

2 Paragraph 1—code of conduct

A relevant authority must secure that its code of conduct includes the provisions the authority considers appropriate in respect of the registration and disclosure of pecuniary interests and interests other than pecuniary interests: see the Localism Act 2011 s 28(2).

3 Paragraph 3—notice of disclosable pecuniary interest

See the Localism Act 2011 s 31(3) and the Relevant Authorities (Disclosable Pecuniary Interests) Regulations 2012, SI 2012/1464.

4 Paragraph 5—criminal offences

As to criminal offences see the Localism Act 2011 s 34. For details of the ethical framework and the consequences of breach of the local authority code of members' conduct, see Paragraph 60 [327] above.

5 Paragraph 6—inspection of register

The monitoring officer of a relevant authority (other than a parish council) must secure that a copy of the authority's register is available for inspection at a place in the authority's area at all reasonable hours and published on the authority's website: see the Localism Act 2011 s 29(5). In the case of a parish council, the parish council's monitoring officer must secure that a copy of the parish council register is available for inspection at a place in the principal authority's area at all reasonable hours and published on the principal authority's website: Localism Act 2011 s 29(6). The parish council must separately secure

that its register is published on its website if it has one: see the Localism Act 2011 s 29(7).

For the meaning of 'principal authority' in relation to a parish council see the Localism Act 2011 s 29(9).

6 Schedule question A—employment etc—partner
As to the meaning of 'your partner' see SI 2012/1464 reg 1
and the Localism Act 2011 s 30(3)(b).

7 Schedule question B—sponsorship—12 months i.e. the period of 12 months ending with the day on which the member gives a notification for the purposes of the Localism Act 2011 ss 30(1), 31(7).

8 Schedule question C-securities

'Securities' means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000, and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society: SI 2012/1464 reg 1(2).

9 Schedule question D-contracts

As to the meaning of 'your partner' see SI 2012/1464 reg 1 and the Localism Act 2011 s 30(3)(b).

A 'body in which the relevant person has a beneficial interest' means a firm in which the relevant person is a partner, or a body corporate of which the relevant person is a director, or in the securities of which the relevant person has a beneficial interest: SI 2012/1464 reg 1(2). A director includes a member of the committee of management of a registered society within the meaning given by the Cooperative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014 s 1(1), other than a society registered as a credit union: SI 2012/1464 reg 1(2) (as amended by SI 2014/1815).

10 Schedule question E1—land

'Land' excludes an easement, servitude, interest or right in or over land that does not carry with it a right for the relevant person (alone or jointly with another) to occupy the land or to receive income: SI 2012/1464 reg 1(2).

11 Schedule question E3—corporate tenancies
As to a 'body in which the relevant person has a beneficial interest' see note ⁹.
